# **Programme Note**

At risk of revealing a little of how the sausage is made, I wish to recall how The United States vs Ulysses came to be, and the crucial roles played in that by many people - whose names don't make it to the poster.

The genesis of the play lay (not for the first time) in a chat with Des Gunning, who was hatching a Joycean plan (not for the first time) to do an online reading, during the pandemic, of the Woolsey decision. What's the Woolsey decision?, I asked.

I was soon recruited - but, instead of reading the decision, I wanted to reconstruct the argument, based on whatever court reports were available. Darina Gallagher of the James Joyce Centre offered a commission and introduced me to Declan Dunne, author of a novel based on the court case, Set at Random: The Book that Wouldn't Lie Down. (The hero of Declan's novel is, rather ingeniously, a fictional assistant in the publisher Random House, who comes to play a crucial role in the court case.) Declan generously allowed me use his own reconstructions of the court case for that first draft, which the theatre company AboutFACE presented in an online reading for the Joyce Centre in early 2021.

Enter Kevin Brew of RTÉ Drama on One. Kevin commissioned a radio version, suggested the idea of exploring the Circe episode's delirious court scene, and brought Conall Morrison on board to direct. With more time, I went back to the original court documents (helpfully collected in a volume published in 1984) and to various other sources (see bibliography). Des Gunning, meanwhile, had recruited Brooklyn-based Joycean Jim Keeley to the cause, and Jim discovered that the radio serial The March of Time had broadcast a re-enactment of the case. Thankfully, that was lost in the mists of time; I was free to imagine it.

We started to think of the possibility of a stage version. An Arts Council Agility Award allowed me bring Conall and the radio cast back together for a workshop, where the first item on the agenda was to explore whether or not to retain the radio-play framing. (Actors Stephen Hogan and Killian Scott were a key part of the radio production and the early workshop process; Karen Ardiff and Ali White also contributed to the workshop.) Producer Cally Shine introduced me to Once Off Productions, and Hugh Murray here at the Pavilion offered crucial support. We presented a series of work-in-progress readings at the Pavilion for Bloomsday 2022 (in association with the James Joyce Centre and the International James Joyce Symposium, and with support from Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown Arts Office). Thanks to the reaction to that, and - crucially - to a production award from the Arts Council, that process has culminated in the production you see tonight. Behind the scenes, Ruth, Zack, Iseult & Elena offered invaluable advice, support, meals, cakes and more cakes.

Hopefully, this odyssey does not stop here. This is a New York story as much as Ulysses is a Dublin one. We hope to get the wind in our sails, and bring it across the ocean.
